GROUND RULES FOR THE RED BLUFF ROUND-UP, APRIL 18th, 19th 20th, 2025.

1. THE SCORELINES ARE NOT THOSE ACCORDING TO THE RULEBOOK. THE COMMITTEE SETS THE FOLLOWING SCORELINES WHICH CANNOT BE CHANGED WITHOUT PRIOR APPROVAL OF THE RBRU COMMITTEE:

2. SLACK BARREL RACE – FRIDAY, APRIL 18th, 2025 AT 10:00 A.M. **(See Below)**

4. ALL TIMED EVENTS HAVE TWO-HEAD – W/TOP 24 TO FRIDAY & SATURDAY PERFORMANCE. TOP 12 FROM FRIDAY AND SATURDAY IN SUNDAY PERFORMANCE. FASTEST LAST ON SUNDAY

5. ALL TIMED EVENTS:

ONE FULL GO-AROUND ON WEDNESDAY, APRIL 16TH, 2025 AT 9:00 A.M.

2ND FULL GO-AROUND – THURSDAY, APRIL 17TH, 2025 AT 9:00 A.M.

TD, TR, SW, LIMITED TO 80 CONTESTANTS

6. **** Contestants will be asked to sign autographs and mingle with VIP's in Rodeo Sky box.**

7. ARENA POLICING

In the timed events, only the contestant who is competing is allowed in the arena. No horses are allowed in Arena when tractor is working. Contestants MUST have back numbers on.

8. STALLS

There are limited stalls available on a first come basis. The cost is \$80.00 a week, Monday through Sunday. No hot wire pens. No panel pens in parking area. Stalls can be prepaid by calling (530) 527-1000 and put on your credit card.

11. **Girls Barrel Racing Friday, April 18th, 2025.** First go-round starts at 10:00 A.M. - Second go-round will start one (1) hour after the first go ends.
12. Companion ticket may be requested from the designated contestant check-in booth prior to each performance.
13. ALL EVENTS – No multi-event buddies will be accepted. There will be an extended grace period for those contestants who are entered and meet qualifications to change preferences.
14. Replacement Deadline to be the same as the turnout deadline. 3 hours prior. (Applies to PRCA events only)
15. Tie-Down Roping stock charge \$35 paid to Red Bluff Round-Up.
16. ALL CONTESTANTS – All contestants must sign a release of liability with the secretary before competing in this rodeo.
17. ALL CONTESTANTS – Contestants must park horse trailers in designated area.
18. ALL CONTESTANTS – Riding Events: If a contestant is not ready when called upon, either by the chute boss (in agreement with the judges) or the judge(s), may fine contestant \$250 for the first offense, that fine progressively doubling with each subsequent offense, and/or may be disqualified by the judges. If an individual is taking advantage of the contestants in that event and/or the livestock and order the rodeo production and or not cooperating with the chute boss and judges' instructions resulting in an attempt to cheat or influence the results of the event, to include but not limited to causing an animal to act up or be unruly in the chute in order to receive a re-ride, that individual will be disqualified by the judges from the rodeo. For contestants, the definition of "ready when called" shall be;
- Bareback Riding**; Contestant must be over horse with hand in rigging when previous horse leaves the arena. If contestant is first to compete this would be when the flag horse leaves the arena or as instructed by the chute boss and/or judges. If a contestant and has a fair opportunity to compete and does not call for his competition animal, delaying the production of the rodeo, the same ruling will apply.
- Saddle Bronc Riding**; Contestant must have horse cinched (front and rear) with the rein measured, and be in the chute, mounting the horse when the previous horse leaves the arena. If contestant is first to compete this would be when the flag horse leaves the arena or as instructed by the chute boss and/or judges. If a contestant has a fair opportunity to compete and does not call for his competition animal, delaying the production of the rodeo, the same ruling will apply.
- Bull Riding**; Contestant must be pulling rope when previous bull leaves the arena. If contestant is first to compete this would be when the flag horse leaves the arena or as instructed by the chute boss and/or judges. If a contestant has a fair opportunity to compete and does not call for his competition animal, delaying the production of the rodeo, the same ruling will apply.
- Timed Events**; If in the opinion of the chute boss and/or the judges if a contestant is not "ready when called" the contestant will be subject to a penalty by definition, "ready when called" shall mean that the contestant must be riding into the box when the previous animal leaves the arena. If a contestant is the first contestant in team roping or tie-down roping they shall be riding into the box and in steer wrestling, riding into the arena when flag (sponsor) horse leaves the arena or as instructed by the chute boss and/or judges.

19. RE – Riding event stock will be drawn at least 72 hours prior to the first performance.
20. POST: All areas behind the chutes will be considered part of the arena. To gain access to this area, contestants must be dressed according to PRCA rules and have their back numbers visible. Contestants must wear back numbers, which are clearly visible, at all times upon entrance to and while in the arena whether competing or not. Back numbers must be worn when competing in slack and performances.
21. POST: Only rodeo contestants with a valid contestant number will be allowed behind the chutes and in the chute or arena are. Numbers must be clearly visible. Anyone caught with an invalid number (one not belonging to them) will have that number confiscated. Anyone giving their number to someone else and/or the recipient of the number will be turned into the PRCA Officials and will be subject to the 2 year ban.
22. POST: In accordance with PRCA by-law (B15.1.9) this is to notify that the Red Bluff Round-Up will only admit contestants who are entered in the competition to facilities at no charge. PRCA members who are not entered will not be given free admission, nor may they enter any area restricted only to contestants without proper credentials.
23. POST: Timed event contestants that win awards must be at the autograph signing following Sunday's performance to take pictures with sponsors and to receive their awards.
24. RE-ENTRIES:
25. Team ropers (headers & heelers), tie-down ropers, breakaway ropers must enter from back of box.
26. If the timed event animal escapes or is replaced for any reason or a re-run is given for any other reason, the first available extra will be used and remained in that pen. The escaped animal would then become the first extra for that pen.
27. **NO TIME JERK DOWN RULE WILL BE ENFORCED**
28. All-Around Award; Any contestant WPRA or PRCA member that has the most money won in at least 2 events will be the recipient of the All-Around Award buckle.

Saturday performance starts at 2:30 P.M.
Sunday performance starts at 1:30 P.M.

NON RESIDENTS OF CALIFORNIA

In accordance with the State of California withholding requirements for **Out-of-State residents**, all individuals with cumulative winnings of \$1,500.00 or more will be subject to a 7% state income tax withholding on 100% of their winnings.

FOREIGN PARTICIPANTS

The Red Bluff Round-Up Association will also confirm to the U.S. backup withholding requirements on winners from a foreign country.

OTHER INFORMATION ADDITIONS

1. **Special Awards:** All Around Buckle, Pete Owens Memorial Buckle, John McDonald Memorial Buckle, Bull Riding Champion Buckle and buckles given to all event winners. Yeti Coolers to all event winners Saddle given to Sunday's Wild Ride Winner.
2. **Accompanying arena events:** Horse races, team bronc riding, mutton busting, and wild pony races in each performance. Wild Ride on Sunday only.

GROUND RULES FOR WPRA BARREL RACING

- There will be two full go-rounds. Everyone runs first go-round Friday, April 18th, 2025 at 10:00 A.M. Second go-round will start back one (1) hour after the first go ends.
- The top 36 will be held to the performances and will run slowest to fastest, however each performance will be random competition drawn.
- All remaining barrel racers will run in reverse/flip order of the 1st go-round, excluding the top 36.
- Tractor drag to be after 6 girls run, and thru the completion of the 2nd go-round in slack. Condense drag per rule 12.8.2.1.1
- Trades will be permitted in the second go-round, between the performances only. Trades must be completed one (1) hour after first go-round ends and BEFORE the beginning of second go-round. Random Competition Draw for perfs will be held after trades are closed.
- Second go-round trades allowed perf to perf only. THERE WILL BE NO TRADES TO SLACK. Secretaries discretion whether trade is legal.
- Barrel Racer may choose to set her run up as allowed in the 2025 WPRA Rule Book, even if the pattern is centered to gate.
- WPRA contestants competing on Saturday and Sunday performances may be required to sign autographs following performances.
- All contestants must wear the back number provided by Red Bluff Round-Up Rodeo Secretary- which must be visible at all times upon entrance to the rodeo grounds, whether competing or not. Any misuse of back number will be cause for disqualification.

GROUND RULES FOR WPRA BREAK-A-AWAY ROPING

- WPRA Breakaway rules & ground rules will be in effect.
- Score maybe same as PRCA Tie-down roping event. Extra liner may be used.
- All contestants must sign a release of liability with the secretary before competing.
- Limit 80
- Contestants will draw one head.
- Tentative Schedule – Those who are draw in Slack will compete Thursday, April 17th, 2025 at no earlier than 2:00 P.M. following the PRCA timed events.
- If contestant is drawn for the Friday, Saturday or Sunday performance they will follow 1st Section of Saddle Broncs in order of the draw (Times Subject to change) ~~10~~¹² contestants in each performance.
- Contestants may be asked to mingle with VIP's in Rodeo Sky Box.
- Contestants will be requested to sign autographs following the performance on Saturday and Sunday in the arena.
- Only the contestant who is competing is allowed in the arena. No horses are allowed in the arena when tractor is working.
- Buckle to event winner.
