RODEO: Utah Days of '47 Rodeo

CITY: Salt Lake City, Utah

PERF DATES: July 22-26, 2025, 8:00 p.m. SLACK DATES: July 22-25, 2025, 10:00 a.m.

BREAKAWAY

- 1. Entries limited to forty (40) contestants. No exemptions. Qualifications: Winners from 2024 Rodeos Eagle Mountain, UT, Monticello, UT, Delta, UT, and Manila, UT. Top 13 from 2024 Pro Rodeo Breakaway World Standings. Top 12 from 2025 Pro Rodeo Breakaway World Standings based on winnings seven days prior to entry closing. Top 6 from the 2024 Pro Rodeo Breakaway Wilderness Circuit Standings. Top 5 from the 2025 Pro Rodeo Breakaway Wilderness Circuit Standings based on winnings seven days prior to entry closing. If the winners from stated do not enter, the next highest ranked contestants from the 2025 Pro Rodeo Breakaway World Standings will be accepted.
- 2. The "30-hour replacement" policy will be in effect. A release or a notified turnout after the 30-hour deadline can be replaced by an alternate from a list of contestants that were drawn out due to qualifications, as long as the notification is made through the rodeo secretary (Eva Chadwick 602-672-8660) by 5:00 pm the night before the morning slack. Breakaway contestants will only be replaced prior to their first goround in slack. Replacements must be made prior to the first goround of competition.
- 3. Entry Fee: \$521 (\$500 entry fee + \$21 Procom Fee). No stock charge.
- 4. Format: Two Go/Ave + Finals (8).
- 5. Two (2) go rounds, back-to-back. Slack each morning, ten (10) contestants go 1, then those same ten (10) contestants will compete in the performance that night, go 2 in reverse order.
- 6. SLACK ORDER GBR, TD, LBK, TR, SW,
- 7. Trades: Back-to-back. 1st go trades will be permitted as usual through PROCOM and continuing with the rodeo secretary. Contestants will have until 8:00 am (Mountain Time) the first day of competition to complete trades (both gos must be traded) with the rodeo secretary. The deadline applies to the first performance in the trade. For example, if contestants are trading between the 1st and the 4th performance, the trade deadline is at 8:00 a.m. on the day of 1st performance. If contestants are trading between the 2nd and 3rd performances, the trade deadline is at 8:00 a.m. on the day of the 2nd performance.
- 8. The top two (2) contestants in the average for the set (slack/perf) advance to the Finals. Replacements will be made from the vacated qualifier's set.
- Advancement Tie Breakers: If there are fewer than two (2) qualified times in a set, the
 advancing contestant will be the next fastest average time from any of the sets. Ties will
 be broken by the single fastest time in any previous round, then 2025 Pro Rodeo
 Breakaway World Standings all as of July 7, 2025.
- 10. Competition order for the Finals will be random.
- 11. Back-to-back cattle one enough.
- 12. Escaped Animal / Reruns: If an animal escapes or a re-run is due for any other reason, the extra will be used.
- 13. This rodeo is a part of the Playoff Series.

BARREL RACING

- 1. Entries limited to eighty (80) contestants. No exemptions. Qualifications: Winners from 2024 Rodeos Moab, UT, Eagle Mountain, UT, Monticello, UT, Delta, UT, Lehi, UT, and Manila, UT, then the top 18 from the 2024 World Standings, then the top 30 in the 2025 Worlds Standings as of July 7, 2025, then the top 2 from the 2024 WPRA Tour (will not drop below 20th in standings), then top 9 from the 2024 Wilderness Circuit Standings, then top 15 from the 2025 Wilderness Circuit Standings as of July 7, 2025, entering will be accepted as entries. If the winners from stated rodeos do not enter, the next highest ranked contestants from the 2025 World Standings will be accepted.
- 2. The "30-hour replacement" policy will be in effect. A release or a notified turnout after the 30-hour deadline can be replaced by an alternate from a list of contestants that were drawn out due to qualifications, as long as the notification is made through the rodeo secretary (Eva Chadwick 602-672-8660) at least 6 hours prior to the scheduled evening performance in which the contestant is being replaced or 5:00 pm the night before the morning slack in which the contestant is being replaced.
- 3. Entry Fee: \$271 (\$250 entry fee + \$21 Procom Fee)
- 4. Format: One Go + Finals (8).
- 5. Ten (10) contestants run in morning slack. Ten (10) contestants run in evening performance.
- 6. SLACK ORDER GBR, TD, LBK, TR, SW
- 7. TRADES: 1st go trades will be permitted as usual through PROCOM and continuing with the rodeo secretary. Contestants up in the slack will have until 8:00 am (Mountain Time) on the first day of competition to complete trade. Contestants up in the evening performance will have until 12:00 pm (noon). The deadline applies to the first slack/performance in the trade. For example, if contestants are trading between the 1st and the 4th slack, the trade deadline is 8:00 am the day of the 1st slack. If contestants are trading between the 2nd and 3rd slacks, the trade deadline is 8:00 am on the day of the 2nd slack. If contestants are trading between the 1st performance and the 4th slack, the trade deadline is noon on the day of the 1st performance.
- 8. The top one (1) fastest time from each slack and top one (1) fastest time from each performance advance to the Finals. Replacements will be made from the vacated qualifier's slack/perf.
- 9. Advancement Tie Breakers: Ties will be broken by the-2025 WPRA Barrel Racing World Standings all as of July 7, 2025.
- 10. Competition order in the Finals will be random.
- 11. Condensed drag (5) per rule 12.8.2.1.1. Drag after five (5) in Performances and hand rake after each contestant. Drag after four (4) in Finals and hand rake after each contestant.
- 12. Barrel racers competing in morning slack you must leave within two hours of the completion of your run.
- 13. This rodeo is a part of the Playoff Series.

Clean slate in the Final Round. Qualifiers in the Final Round will earn the payoff, with or without a time. If there are fewer qualified times in the Finals than there are places to be paid, the remaining places to be paid to contestants with no time will be based on the 1) Breakaway – Average, 2) Barrels – fastest time in the previous round and, if

necessary, tiebreakers as outlined for advancement. All money paid out for the Finals will count towards the World Standings and Circuit Standings.

GENERAL:

- 1. Olympic style Gold, Silver, and Bronze medals will be awarded to the top (three) in the Finals.
- 2. Only actual contestant and one (1) companion allowed gate access. Companion tickets will be sold at a discount to contestants needing additional tickets at check-in.
- 3. Contestants must wear back numbers provided by the Utah Days of '47 Rodeo. The back number must be visible outside a vest or jacket.
- 4. Stalls: Utah Days of '47 Arena at Utah State Fairpark has limited stalls and hookups available at no charge. Stalls and hookups are "first come, first served." Contestants are requested to arrive no earlier than 7:00 AM on day of their competition, only utilize stalls for the night they are competing, then vacate by 7:00 AM the following day to accommodate the next group of contestants. Due to very limited stalls and parking, barrel racers competing in morning slack we ask that you please refrain from using a stall and leave within two hours of the completion of your run.
- 5. Pushers and other helpers must be credentialed from the rodeo secretary's office. To obtain credentials, the individual must be a member of the WPRA/PRCA with WPRA/PRCA insurance dues paid for the current year.
- 6. The medal winners in each event are required to participate in an awards ceremony immediately following the conclusion of each event. Failure to comply without approval from Committee, will result in a fine of \$2,500.
- 7. All contestants must sign in at the Utah Days of '47 Rodeo Arena at the Utah State Fairpark rodeo secretary's office and enter the facility at 300 North, 1200 West (gate 17) Salt Lake City, 84116.
- 8. ALL CONTESTANTS WITH HORSES: Must have proof of current health papers issued within 30 days and a current Coggins Test within the previous 12 months. Health requirement papers must not expire while the animal is still on the grounds. All animals must be compliant with current Utah State Animal Health Commission rules, and requirements are subject to change. No exceptions. Contestants must abide by the Utah Days of '47 Rodeo regulations for entry and exit with animals. Individuals who violate animal entry policies will be subject to immediate ejection from the premises.
- 9. All contestants must park where designated in the competitor parking area.
- 10. All contestants must wear a Utah Days of '47 Rodeo patch while competing if provided.
- 11. TIMED EVENTS CONTESTANTS: Are not allowed in the arena at any time other than while competing or a predesignated practice session.
- 12. All areas behind the chutes will be considered part of the arena. To gain access to this area, contestants must be dressed according to PRCA rules and have their back numbers visible. Contestants must wear back numbers provided by Utah Days of '47 Rodeo. Back numbers must be clearly visible on the outside of a vest or jacket, always upon entrance to and while in the arena whether competing or not.
- 13. Only rodeo contestants with a valid contestant number will be allowed behind the chutes and in the chute or arena area. Numbers must be clearly visible. Anyone caught

- with an invalid number (one not belonging to them) will have that number confiscated. Anyone giving their number to someone else will be disqualified.
- 14. NO CHILDREN: Are allowed behind chutes, on chute level, or in the arena. No exceptions. This is to ensure the safety of contestants, rodeo personnel, stock and children themselves. Violation will result in immediate removal from the premises.
- 15. BREAKAWAY: Only the first five contestants will be allowed in the holding area by the box. Arena manager will enforce this and allow those contestants in the arena according to the rodeo secretary's list. After each run, the contestant will leave the arena through the designated exit at the bucking chute end and another contestant will be allowed in. The contestants not competing will be asked to stay in the holding pen until their turn to compete. Current winners will be asked to return to the holding area for interviews.
- 16. TIES FOR MEDAL PLACEMENT IN THE FINALS: In the breakaway, ties will be broken by the contestant with the fastest average time in the long rounds. If still tied, tie is broken by the contestant with the single fastest time in either of the first two go-rounds. If still tied, then the tied contestant with the highest ranking based on 2025 World Standings as of July 7, 2025, will be awarded the medal. In the barrel racing, ties will be broken by the contestant with the fastest time in the long round. If still tied, then the tied contestant with the highest ranking based on 2025 World Standings as of July 7, 2025, will be awarded the medal.
- 17. Contestants will not change clothes in the arena or arena area. Changing of clothes or attire will be done in the contestant locker room. This will be strictly enforced by security.
- 18. DOGS: All dogs must be kept at the trailer and on a leash, except for contract acts.
