## 2026 Tucson Rodeo Ground Rules-WPRA

1. Performance/Slack Information:

- 2. All contestants will be required to sign a contestant release form before they will be allowed to compete.
- 3. All contestants will be required to enter the competition arena through the alley gate at a run.
- 4. Limited number of portable pens will be available on a first come, first served basis while availability last.
- 5. Fenced warm-up arena and alley adjacent to timed event chutes along with header/heeler boxes shall be considered part of the arena and subject to member dress code.
- 6. One hundred five (105) entries: 56 selected from 2025 Pro Rodeo World Standings; 14 selected from 2026 Pro Rodeo World Standings seven days prior to entries closing; 24 selected from 2025 WPRA Turquoise Circuit Standings; 6 selected from 2026 WPRA Turquoise Circuit Standings seven days prior to entries closing; 5 will be selected from 2025 WPRA Tour Standings.
- 7. Format will be one (1) round with Finals: top twelve (12). Will run twelve (12) contestants each performance.

- 8. Slack: First section of Slack will be Monday, February 23rd, 2026, at 8:00am. Barrels will be run first with twenty-three (23) runs. Second section will be Tuesday, February 24<sup>th</sup>, 2026, at 8:00am. Barrels will be run first with twenty-two (22) runs.
- 9. Gound and Arena Access rules will be posted in the PRCA Secretary's office.
- 10. In case of any malfunction of the electric timer for any reason, field flagger times will be used. No re-runs will be given for any reason.
- 11. Barrels may not be placed in the arena for practice at anytime. Access to arena for contestants will be set by the Arena Director. No warming up horses in the arena during any paid Performance.
- 12. Contestants must wear back numbers when competing during paid Performances.
- 13. Contestants who park on Third Avenue (East of the Rodeo Grounds) or on private property along Third Avenue may be subject to ticketing, and/or towing at the vehicle owners expense. The Tucson Police Department will site anyone who leaves refusing to clean up (including manure, hay, trash, etc.) along Third Avenue on either Public or Private property.
- 14. The Tucson Rodeo Committee will tow ANY vehicle parked in an unauthorized area, at the owners expense, on the Tucson Rodeo Grounds.
